Notes

- The minimum graduation credit requirement is 128 credits.
- Required courses total 70 credits: 25 credits for common required courses, 21 credits for departmental required courses, 18 credits for program-specific required courses, and 6 credits for cross-program required courses.
- Elective courses total 58 credits, including at least 24 credits from program-specific electives. Cross-college and inter-university electives are capped at 17 credits.
- Students must pass the "Hakka Language Proficiency Certification Basic Level" issued by the Hakka Affairs Council to graduate.
- Students who already hold a mid-level or higher Hakka Language Proficiency Certification from the Hakka Affairs Council before enrollment may apply to waive "Basic Hakka" within one week after the start of the semester. The waiver is subject to approval by the course instructor and department head. However, any missing credits due to the waiver must be compensated by taking additional elective courses within the department.
- Double Major Regulations : Follow the university's "Double Major Study Regulations." The required courses total 48 credits, with 14 credits of elective courses to be chosen.
